

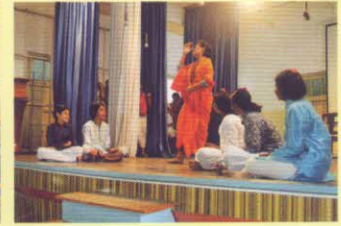

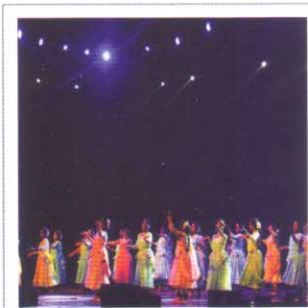
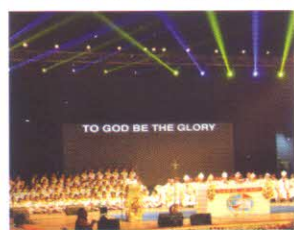

175 years of Celebration

On a cold wintry day, December 30th 1841, Scotia, a ship from the Emerald Isle docked at Babughat. On board was Delphine Hart and her band of 11 valiant women. They re-designed the world of education for the girl child, building social foundations into the future on a bedrock.

December 30th 2016 was a red letter day for the Loreto family. In its 175th year, Loreto celebrated in joy and gratitude. High Mass followed by a cultural program at Science City kicked off the year long celebrations. Loreto spells magic!

In its 175th year, we celebrate the Loreto spirit dwelling within each Loreto girl. It is a celebration of deep, undying bonds of friendship, a celebration of the commitment to the vision of Mary Ward.



JPIC (AGM)

The JPIC National General Meeting 2016- URJA was held in Loreto Convent Delhi from 16th to 18th September 2016. Teachers and students from each of the 15 Loreto schools in India attended this meet.

Sister Anita Braganza, Provincial leader South Asia, Sister Sabrina Edwards, first Consultor and JPIC link person, Sister Nirmala Arul, Principal Loreto House and link person to the United Nations and the National JPIC coordinators, presided over this forum. The event comprised of extensive panel discussions by esteemed environmental experts, who shared their views and encouraged the students through a mock parliament to become Green Crusaders for the future.

Sister Nirmala Arul, Principal Loreto House and link person to the United Nations, briefed the participants about the 17 Sustainable Development Goals (SDG) having 169 targets and 364 indicators.

The event concluded with the following Actionable Goals being passed:

1. Loreto Schools in India commit to dedicate 1 lakh trees to the Nation by 2020.
2. Loreto Schools in India commit to making their schools Carbon Neutral by 2020.

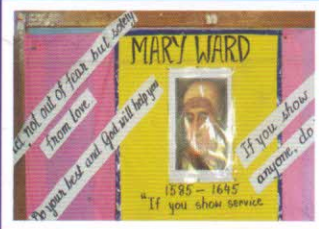
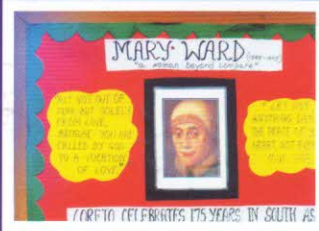
